<b>Also Known As</b>	Custer's Last Stand
<b>Dates</b>	June 25th and 26th, in 1876
<b>Locations</b>	Little Big Horn River, Montana
<b>Participants</b>	U.S. Army, General Custer, Major Reno, The Lakota, Dakota, Cheyenne, and Arapaho tribes were led by famous chiefs including Sitting Bull, Crazy Horse, Chief Gall, Lame White Man, and Two Moon.
<b>How it got its name</b>	The battle got its name because it took place near the banks of the Little Big Horn River in Montana.
<b>Outcome</b>	It was the greatest Native American victory and the worst U.S. Army loss during the Plains Indian War. The Native American victory was a collective act of resistance against the ongoing encroachment of the white man on Native American life and culture. However, Custer's defeat confirmed the white American belief that the Native Americans were barbaric and vicious. Ultimately, it sped up the rate at which the U.S. Army was sent to subdue the Native American tribes.
