



ANSWERS

1. It was an open letter written on April 16, 1963, by Martin Luther King Jr. from a jail in Birmingham.
2. Letter from Birmingham City Jail, "The Negro Is Your Brother"
3. He was imprisoned as a participant in nonviolent demonstrations against segregation
4. He was responding to a public statement of concern and caution issued by eight white Southern religious leaders.
5. People have a moral responsibility to refuse to follow unjust laws and to act directly against injustice rather than waiting for justice to come through the judicial system.
