An event or outcome is directly foreshadowed when the author openly or directly suggests what might happen.

An event or outcome is indirectly foreshadowed when the author gives subtle clues to it in the story.

A prophecy foreshadows important events in the plot without revealing the details of how it will happen.

An event or outcome is foreshadowed through symbolism or omen when minor or seemingly unimportant details in the story are actually hints about what is going to happen.
