## Name the Animal Answer Key

1. The Bat. Bats use echolocation, emitting high-frequency sounds and listening for the echoes to navigate and locate prey in the dark.
2. The Emperor Penguin. The Emperor Penguin is the largest species of penguin and can reach heights of up to 4 feet (1.2 meters). They are known for their distinctive black and white plumage.
3. The Bowhead Whale. Bowhead Whales have an estimated lifespan of over 200 years, making them the longest-lived mammals on land.
4. The Lizard. Many lizard species have the remarkable ability to regenerate their tails if they are severed or dropped as a defense mechanism.
5. The Sailfish. Sailfish are known for their incredible speed in the water, capable of reaching speeds up to 68 miles per hour (110 kilometers per hour).
6. The Camel. Camels are well-adapted to arid environments and are often called the "ship of the desert" due to their ability to endure long periods without water.
7. The Komodo Dragon. Komodo Dragons are the largest species of lizard, growing up to 10 feet (3 meters) in length and weighing over 150 pounds (70 kilograms).
8. The Bald Eagle is the national bird and symbol of the United States.
9. The Wildebeest. Wildebeests undertake an annual migration across the Serengeti-Mara ecosystem, covering a distance of about 800 miles (1,300 kilometers).
