It's origins can be traced back to 1942 when representatives from 26 Allied nations signed the Declaration by United Nations, a pledge to fight together against the Axis powers. This declaration laid the foundation for the future United Nations. The term "United Nations" was first coined by President Franklin D. Roosevelt in 1942.

The formal establishment of the United Nations occurred on October 24, 1945, when the UN Charter was ratified by 51 nations in San Francisco, The UN Charter outlined the organizations structure and principles, emphasizing the importance of diplomacy, peaceful resolution of conflicts, and the promotion of human rights. The UN was officially launched on January 1, 1946. Since its inception, the United Nations has grown to include nearly all sovereign nations as members and has played a central role in addressing global challenges, including humanitarian crises conflicts, poverty, climate change, and disease control. It operates through various specialized agencies, such as the World Health Organization (WHO), United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO), and United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF), to fulfill its mission of maintaining international peace and security, fostering cooperation, and advancing human rights and development worldwide.
