1. a place where people are kept in order to separate them from other populations
2. They believed they spread diseases. The use of ghettos was part of their plans to “purify” the German race by getting rid of “inferior” people.
3. The original Nazi plan, called the Madagascar Plan, was to use the ghettos as temporary holding places until all the Jews in Poland could be deported to the island of Madagascar. It was abandoned because the superiority of the British navy made it logistically impossible.
4. Warsaw ghetto
5. At its peak capacity, in April of 1941, 465,000 people lived there, including 85,000 children.
6. A conference in January 1942 in Berlin where the Nazis decided to begin exterminating (killing) the Jewish people.
