Susan B. Anthony	One of the most visible leaders in the women's suffrage movement in the 19 th century
Ruby Bridges	One of the first African American child to attend formerly whites-only William Frantz Elementary School in Louisiana during the New Orleans school desegregation crisis on November 14, 1960
Cesar Chavez	Co-founded the National Farm Workers Association in 1962 and fought for the rights of farm workers
Frederick Douglass	A former slave who became a national leader of the abolitionist movement in the 19 th century
Mohandas Gandhi	An Indian lawyer, anti-colonial nationalist and political ethicist who used nonviolent resistance to successfully lead India's independence from British rule in the early 20 th century
Helen Keller	Co-founded the American Civil Liberties Union, she was an activist for women and the disabled and active in the women's suffrage movement.
Nelson Mandela	South Africa's first democratically elected president
Jackie Robinson	The first African American to play Major League Baseball in the modern era.
Booker T. Washington	The dominant leader in the African-American community and of the contemporary Black elite from 1890 and 1915 and advisor to several presidents.
