protest: a public expression of objection, disapproval or dissent, usually towards a political idea or action

nonviolence: the use of peaceful means rather than force to bring about positive political change.

discrimination: unjust or prejudicial treatment of categories of people based on their belonging to that category

civil rights: a class of rights that protect individuals' freedom from infringement by governments, social organizations, and private individuals. They ensure one's entitlement to participate in the civil and political life of society and the state without discrimination or repression

boycott: an act of nonviolent, voluntary abstention from a product, person, organization, or country as an expression of protest for moral, social, political, or environmental reasons

segregation: the systematic separation of people into racial or other ethnic groups in daily life.
