1. They were serfs (peasants)
2. They lived and worked on a lord's manor in exchange for his protection. most did agricultural work. Some serfs worked as servants, merchants, bakers, doctors, and lawyers.
3. Serf's homes were very small, crowded, and dark.
4. laws limiting private expenditure on food and personal items
5. Clothing for serfs was made from wool.
6. Serfs ate bread and stews made mostly of vegetables with a little meat. Meat, cheese, and eggs were eaten primarily on special occasions. Wealthy people had more variety.
7. water quality was poor and inconsistent.
8. Very few children went to school. Some boys were apprenticed at a young age to learn craft. The wealthy often hired tutors to teach their children.
