1. Intertextuality refers to the fact that all texts are interconnected. Every text that is created is affected by the content, reasoning, and aesthetic choices of all the texts that preceded it.
2. Text, in the broadest sense of the word, includes novels, philosophy, journalism, song lyrics, and all works of art in general.
3. The two types of intertextuality are:
 - Deliberate Intertextuality is when the author consciously chooses to reference or draw upon another work, creating a relationship between the new work and the old one.
 - Latent Intertextuality is when relationships appear between a new text and an older one without the conscious intention of the newer work's creator. Latent intertextuality occurs because everything you have ever been exposed to is stored somewhere in your subconscious mind and contributes to your world view, which in turn contributes to what and how you create.
