Invective

language intended to insult or offend

is also communicated through tone and is typically accompanied by negative emotion

can be high (formal, creative) or low (rude, offensive)

the purpose of invective is to arouse negative emotions, both in the reader or audience and in the individual at whom the invective is aimed

can be a single word or more lengthy, but is a single expression

Both Invective and Diatribe

both are negative

both are serious, strong verbal messages

Diatribe

is a form of public speaking

an entire speech that attacks

typically acrimonious or bitter

typically lengthy
