Its goal is to elicit a strong emotional response from the audience. Includes little character development, stereotypical characters, and over-the-top, sensational plots.

While melodrama can be so over the top that it can make audiences laugh, it is not intended to evoke laughter.

Both Melodrama and Tragedy

both are drama

neither are intended to be funny

Tragedy

A tragedy is a kind of story in which the protagonist meets an unfortunate end either due to a character flaw or the cruelty of fate.

Tragedy is intended to evoke terror and pity

Tragedy is the opposite of comedy.
