4. An epitaph is brief and concise, while a eulogy is much longer. An epitaph is engraved on a tombstone, while a eulogy is spoken or written (for example, in a newspaper). A eulogy can be used to remember or honor someone who is still alive, while an epitaph is always on a tombstone.
