Chiasmus: a literary device in which the grammar of one phrase is inverted in the phrase that follows, so two key concepts from the original phrase reappear in the second phrase in inverted order.

Antithesis: in a chiasmus, the order or relation of the ideas is inverted; in an antithesis, the ideas are replaced with their opposites.

Juxtaposition: putting two images next to each other for effect. A chiasmus can juxtapose two images/concepts, but not every juxtaposition is a chiasmus.
