Ramadan is an Islamic holiday that takes place in the ninth month of the Islamic calendar.

Ramadan is celebrated by the Islamic/Muslim faith.

Muslims celebrate the month of Ramadan by fasting (not eating or drinking) from sunrise to sunset. The morning meal is eaten before sunrise. After the sun sets, families gather for large meals that often include traditional Muslim foods like stew, rice, dates, and lentils.

Ramadan concludes with a three-day festival and feasting.

Ramadan symbols include the eight-pointed star, lanterns, the crescent moon and star, the drummer, and the mosque.
