## Lunar New Year Across Cultures: China, Vietnam, and Korea

### Answer Key

1. **Hóngbǎo** – They are red envelopes filled with money, given for good luck, especially to children and unmarried adults.
2. Food: **bánh chưng**; Flower: **hoa mai** or **hoa đào** (depending on region).
3. **Charye** is a memorial ceremony where families honor their ancestors with food offerings.
4. In Vietnam, elders are shown respect by receiving **lì xì** (red envelopes), while in Korea, elders are honored through **sebae**, where children bow and receive blessings and money.
5. Answers will vary but should mention themes like family, respect for elders, cultural pride, and traditions (e.g., honoring ancestors, wearing traditional clothing, preparing symbolic foods).
