Connectives

Connectives are words or short phrases that connect words in a sentence or connect independent clauses into one sentence and show the relationship between them. The three most common Connectives are *and*, *but* and *or*. Use a comma before these connectives when joining sentences.

Jane loves her pets, but they do not love each other.

Jane keeps the goldfish bowl on a shelf, or the cat will get him.
