## What Would You Do? Yom Kippur Choices in Real Life Answer Key

The answer key below provides sample reasoning that reflects critical moral thinking. Encourage students to explain their views clearly even if their answers vary.

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### 1. The Missing Sweater

**Wrong.**

Taking something that doesn't belong to you, especially knowing who it belongs to, is dishonest. The right action would be to return it or turn it in.

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### 2. The Half Apology

**Wrong.**

Apologizing without meaning it isn't sincere. Yom Kippur emphasizes *true* teshuvah (repentance), which means owning up and genuinely seeking forgiveness.

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### 3. The Lunchroom Lie

**Wrong.**

Blaming someone else to avoid trouble is unfair and dishonest. It creates harm for the innocent and doesn't show responsibility.

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### 4. The Second Chance

**Right (if she forgives).**

Forgiving someone who sincerely apologizes shows compassion and growth. Yom Kippur teaches that forgiveness can help heal both people.

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
