Sample answers are below

When Tybalt kills Mercutio and Benvolio asks him if he is hurt, Mercutio says "Ay, ay, a scratch, a scratch," then he has dies.

When the Nurse comes to tell Juliet about Mercutio's death, what she says leads Juliet to believe that it is Romeo that has been killed.

When Lady Capulet comes to Juliet's room to talk about when Juliet will marry Paris, Juliet responds to her mother with lines that can be interpreted in two ways. Juliet means that she loves Romeo and wants to change the poison that is supposed to kill him so that it will only make him fall asleep. But the way she says this allows her mother to believe that Juliet wants revenge on Romeo for Tybalt's deal=th.

Lord Capulet uses verbal irony when he refers to the nurse as "my Lady Wisdom" and "Good Prudence."
