Exposition: The town of Maycomb Alabama, with its prejudices, is introduced, along with the Finch family.

Rising Action: Scout, Jem, and Dill become interested Boo Radly. Atticus prepares to defend Tom Robinson in court.

Climax: The jury finds Tom Robinson guilty, in spite of Atticus' best efforts to defend him.

Falling Action: Tom Robinson is shot trying to escape from prison. Scout tries to make sense out of the injustice. Bob Ewell attacks Scout and Jem, and Boo Radly comes out and stabs Ewell, killing him.

Resolution: Scout processes the events of the novel and seems to have come to a more mature perspective, however, there is still the problem of racism in the South.
