

# Degrees of Comparison <sup>A</sup>

**comparative adjective** compares two objects and indicates how they are different. In the sentences below, the comparative adjectives are underlined.

Ryan is faster than Paul.

Jane is quieter than Henry.

Nathan is hungrier than Allen.



A **superlative adjective** describes something that is at the upper or lowest limit of a particular quality.

Millie is the fastest.

Keven is the quietest.

George is the hungriest.
