<u>Prohibition</u>	The period of U.S. history from 1920 to 1933 when alcohol was illegal.
<u>Speakeasy</u>	A secret or hidden bar where people could drink alcohol during Prohibition
<u>Bootleg</u>	To make, distribute, or sell goods illegally
<u>G-man</u>	Short for “government man” or agent of the U.S. government
<u>Blind pig</u>	An illegal drinking establishment during Prohibition
<u>Scofflaw</u>	Someone who fails to comply with a law that is hard to enforce.
<u>Volsteadian</u>	Relating to Prohibition; from the Volstead Act, a 1919 congressional act that enforced prohibition
<u>Bathtub gin</u>	Homemade liquor, especially that produced illegally
<u>Hipflask</u>	A container used to carry alcohol during Prohibition
<u>Gin mill</u>	A distribution place for alcohol during Prohibition
<u>Hooch</u>	Slang term for alcohol during Prohibition
